Coronavirus Pandemic Affects Local, National and International Car Events

At a time of year when sports car and classic car enthusiasts are usually gearing up for a new season of competition and leisure driving, the world-wide Coronavirus pandemic has brought automotive events to a grinding halt.

From JCNA events organized by its 62 affiliate clubs, to renowned international events such as The Indianapolis 500 and Formula One Racing, car-related activities have temporarily taken a back seat to much more important concerns related to the safety and health of all of us during this unprecedented event.

Jaguar Clubs of North America's 2020 Annual General Meeting (AGM), originally set for March 19-22 in Las Vegas, has been rescheduled for August 20-23, 2020. The tentative location is Columbia, SC and the venue is the Columbia Marriott Downtown Hotel.

Additional details will be posted at jcna.com as they become available.

JCOP will continue to monitor recommendations related to COVID-19 and will adjust our 2020 event schedule accordingly. In the meantime, please practice social distancing, wash your hands and join us in looking forward to the time when we can all get together again!

Dave Hershey, president of Susquehanna Valley Jaguar Club, shared one bright spot with the current situation in his letter to members in his club's April newsletter. May 2 Tech Session

Fowler Automotive Street & Track

Come one, come all to a great tech session the morning of Saturday, May 2, 2020 at Fowler Automotive Street and Track (FAST Company) hosted by Dan Fowler, one of the newest members of JCOP. This is a “command performance” event, free to all members and prospective members, such that everyone who comes will walk away most happy they made the effort to attend.

In addition to being able to experience the unique FAST Company environment, arrangements have been made to have two of the top automotive detailers in the country, from Meguiar’s, demonstrate how to clean, polish, “wax” and otherwise detail a car.

Led by Dan Yaworski – who is not only as good a detailer as exists in the US but who has trained many of the best detailers in the country – we will get to watch Dan and the other Meguiar’s rep show us how to attend to any number of issues and questions we have that arise regarding making one’s car look as good as possible.

They will demonstrate the use of any number of compounds, polishes, sealers, “waxes” (including ceramic coatings) and explain what these terms really mean, show the proper methodology and equipment to properly clean and buff and polish an automotive finish, and answer any questions or address any issues anyone has. They can demonstrate interior detailing as well, if desired.

Similarly, anyone wishing for any particular topic to be addressed in detail, let alone demonstrated, might best contact Stu to allow him to alert Dan Yaworski ahead of time so Dan can plan on doing his best to have the proper vehicle or vehicle part present to demonstrate upon. In all likelihood, Meguiar's will also hand out product to our JCOP members to take home.

The word "unique" often gets over-utilized but it is not an understatement to say that FAST Company is a unique place. Check out the web site. Dan Fowler has a shop that performs mechanical work on almost any kind of car or van or truck but depending on the day/week, one can see almost any kind of vehicles there ranging from top exotics in the world to vintage vehicles, to daily drivers, to almost any kind of Porsche or Jaguar or other marques, to vintage race cars built and/or serviced by Dan Fowler and his staff. A \$10,000 car will be sitting in the bay next to a \$1M car.

In addition to getting the vehicles in mechanical shape to run, FAST Company is also a pit crew that supports many vintage racers at the race track most especially those members of the Hartwood Association of Racing Drivers (HARD) who have been coming to British Cars at Hartwood now for some years and parking as a group down by the trees. The "Best of Show" this past year (the 1912 Rolls Royce Silver Ghost, Rio Des Belger bodied) was a HARD member.

At FAST Company one can normally see any number of vintage race cars and other sports cars that are stored there or happen to be there for service at the time we visit. It is like touring a museum where entire cars, or cars in pieces, can be viewed and analyzed and discussed up close. Dan Fowler and his staff are just amazing mechanics.

He has gotten many of the Jaguars of JCOP members (now including every HARD member who has a Jag) back on the road or running in a top notch fashion. Dan Fowler will likely have a number of Jags for us to view that he can talk about in terms of what he has mechanically restored on these vehicles or address the

modern Jags, one of which Dan drives.

If anyone has any specific thing they would like Dan Fowler to talk about or demonstrate, please let Stu Benson know or contact Dan Fowler ahead of time at the above contact information.

Following the Tech Session, arrangements can be made for the JCOP group to go and have lunch at a local establishment. Go to www.fastcoproductions.com and pull up the map. However, if you are coming from the south up Rt. 8 going North, there is a trick you need to follow since one should avoid turning left into the entrance off of Rt. 8 into the FAST Company driveway since the road is bending left and often cars exceed the speed limit and you want to avoid getting rear ended. So please read the directions below. And if, upon leaving FAST Company, you intend to go north, do not turn left onto Rt. 8 but use the similar trick to get back more safely onto Rt. 8. Both maneuvers are described below in detail.

Coming from the North: Go South on Route 8. If you are coming from Exit 39 on the PA Turnpike you have some miles to go. Once anyone gets down through Hampton Township to Shaler Township and sees a Giant Eagle food store and Walgreen's on the right, you are getting closer. At that point keep going south on Rt. 8. You will pass a McTighe's garden center and beer distributor on the right, you will see Three Rivers Harley-Davidson on the right (an orange and black building), and then there will be a stop light and this is close to your turn off so start getting ready to turn to the right. When you come to a black building on the right named Woods Werks BMW/Mini, put on your right turn signal. The road is starting to bend to the right. EAS Roofing will be next on your right and you will TURN RIGHT into the driveway to the south end of EAS Roofing but once you have turned in, stay STRAIGHT and go up the hill and you will arrive at the FAST Company site that is on the hill above EAS Roofing.

Coming from the South on Rt. 8: Get to Rt. 8 where it intersects with Rt. 28 to go to Etna. You can come down Rt. 28 South from Exit 48 (Harmarville) on the PA Turnpike or the Highland Park Bridge or you can come North on Rt. 28 from the North Side of Pittsburgh or you can go from upper Lawrenceville/Morningside area of Pittsburgh North over the 62nd Street Bridge. Once on Rt. 8 North at Etna, keep going north. At the third stoplight (Saxonburg Boulevard) there is an Eat 'n Park on the right. DO NOT JUST DRIVE NORTH AND TURN LEFT INTO THE DRIVEWAY FOR FAST COMPANY SINCE YOU ARE AT RISK FOR GETTING REAR ENDED AND YOU WILL LIKELY MISS THE TURN AT EAS ROOFING COMPANY SINCE IT IS ON A BEND. INSTEAD, go .9 miles further north from the Eat 'n Park where you will BEAR RIGHT onto Old Butler Plank Road that goes to Pannier Company and will pass East Liberty Electroplating. Before you get to this turnoff onto Old Butler Plank Road you will pass Glenshaw Glass on the left ; you will pass Glenshaw Steel on the right *just before* you bear right onto Old Butler Plank Road.

Stay on Old Butler Plank Road as it bends to the left and “T’s” out back onto Rt. 8 right across the street from EAS Roofing. Now you can see well to your left and to your right for oncoming traffic. When the road is clear, you will pull across Rt. 8, taking a jog to your left and then to your right into the driveway to the left side of EAS Roofing. Once in the driveway stay STRAIGHT and go up the hill and you will arrive at the FAST Company site that is on the hill above EAS Roofing.

Leaving FAST COMPANY and wanting to go north on Rt. 8: Do not turn left out of FAST Company onto Rt. 8. It is a blind turn in terms of seeing cars coming North on Rt. 8 and the cars often are speeding and you don’t want to get hit. Instead, coming out of FAST Company, Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 8 south and immediately get into the left lane. Go just a very short distance (less than 100 yards) and turn LEFT (it is a sharp left turn so swing wide) at the very first turn onto Old Butler Plank Road that is before Glenshaw Steel. This road goes to Pannier Company and will pass East Liberty Electroplating. Stay on Old Butler Plank Road as it bends to the left and “T’s” out back onto Rt. 8 right across the street from EAS Roofing. Now you can see well to your left and to your right for oncoming traffic. When the road is clear, you will turn right onto Rt. 8 and head north, having done an almost 360 degree maneuver that takes less than one minute to enhance your safety.

JCNA Website, Jaguar Journal Among Topics Discussed at AGM Video Conference

On Saturday, March 21, I “attended” the digital Special Session of the Annual General Meeting of JCNA. This was a video conferencing meeting of representatives of all the local clubs to review the material which would have been discussed and decided by the AGM for the operation of JCNA. I was tabbed by Dave Hershey to this role because I was too dumb to turn down his request.

This Special Session was primarily a discussion among the key leaders of JCNA and representatives of many local clubs. The By-Laws of the parent organization specifically forbid any voting or any binding decisions in a situation of this sort and there were no attempts to skirt those rules. However, folks were still able to get a sense of what others felt about matters of interest.

One of those was the question of the JCNA website. The present website is a vast improvement upon the version it replaced 5 years ago. That old website was an amateurish, clunky, mishmash which impeded the efforts of everyone using it. Some of us (yours included) feel the same way about the current website and everyone who was involved, admits it can be made much better. The issue is the cost of replacing the website, and of operating the new site. JCNA did not operate in the black last year, and it was troubling that the numbers recited by different people did agree. It was more troubling that JCNA officers want to resolve the problem by raising dues and cannot even agree on how much of an increase is needed. Leadership did get the message that a dues increase will not be well received by the membership.

It is clear that the designers of the new website are aware of the common frustrations local club officials have with the current site. I anticipate that we will all be happier with the new version, based on my trial of portions of the new one. There will also be some pressure to amend the JCNA By-Laws to allow meetings like the AGM to occur online. My own experience was that some SERIOUS work needs to occur to make for a good result in such digital meetings. The get-together was done on the cheap, by folks who had no experience with the platform they were using. Patience will be necessary as the organization struggles to balance various needs, including not having to listen to barking dogs in someone else’s neighborhood.

The Jaguar Journal is a significant cost factor for JCNA and there may be some pressure to charge for paper copies mailed to members. It would be helpful to the officers of this club to hear from each of you as how you would react to switching to a digital copy of the magazine, or how much you would be willing to spend to get a hard copy of it.

The Elephant in the Room was, of course, the coronavirus epidemic, and it will impact our activities for the entire year 2020. Leadership is expecting life to get back to normal by August and have rescheduled the actual, face-to-face, AGM to August 21 in Columbia, SC. Time will tell. There are a number of clubs who are on the verge of cancelling their Concours. If you are planning to show your car at places beyond our club’s Concours, you might want to start checking the websites of those clubs on a weekly basis. Be advised that even though the Governor of Nevada had ordered the closing of all casinos and large gatherings, JCNA still had to pay a \$2500 cancellation fee to the hosting casino. Hotels are being severely hurt by this epidemic and will likely look for any loophole to keep some or all of your prepaid money/deposit.

Finally, any time I get together with leaders from other clubs, I discover ways to do my job better, and this time was no exception. I will explore some ideas of how SVJC interacts with us as members, and report the results of those ideas to you within the next couple of months.

No Rules Changes Will Be Made for the 2020 JCNA Concours Season

The biggest take away from the special JCNA Concours Season video conference on March 28 was that the rules for the 2020 concours season are the same as those for 2019.

Any rule changes passed at the South Carolina AGM in August will take effect for the 2021 season. The club should instruct our delegates to the 2020 AGM on how JCOP wants to vote on these new rules.

The Jaguar Club of Florida Concours, which was scheduled to be held March 20-22, was canceled and it was decided by the club not to schedule an alternate date. The club posted this message on its website: "The decision was made after serious consideration to cancel the 2020 JCOF Concours as a result of COVID-19 concerns, and, instead, focus on plans and preparation for the 2021 JCOF Concours to be held on March 26-28, 2021.

The JCOF 2021 33rd Annual Concours d'Elegance will be held at the Lake Mary Marriott Hotel, 1501 International Parkway, Lake Mary, FL. Registration forms and additional details will be posted at www.jaguarclubfl.com.

The Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh will hold its annual Concours d'Elegance on Saturday, September 12 at the Fox Chapel Yacht Club. More details on the concours will be in the Jargon in the coming months.

This may be a good time to review the way our JCOP members could win North Central Regional or North American Annual Awards. To be eligible for a North American award, a participant must compete in at least three sanctioned Concours d'Elegance in any region. At the end of the year, a review is made for each class in the Champion, Driven and Special divisions, with the top three cars selected with the highest average three scores regardless of the number of concours attended. These participants are awarded First, Second and Third Place North American Awards.



If a participant either was not one of the top three scores in his/her class, or did not attend three concours, then they may be eligible for a Regional (North Central Region) Award.

The participant's two highest scores obtained in the North Central Regional Concours are averaged and compared to all other participants' average scores for their class in the North Central Regional. The top three highest scores are awarded a Regional Award.

If you are one of these winners, you can have your award presented to you at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). If you do not plan to attend the AGM, your trophy will be mailed to you.

World-wide Automotive Events Delayed or Canceled Due to Coronavirus

Here are some of the motorsports events affected by coronavirus, as compiled by Road and Track:

Formula 1: McLaren pulled out of the Australian Grand Prix after a team member tested positive for COVID-19. Hours later, the entire Grand Prix weekend was postponed. F1 has since postponed the Chinese, Bahrain, Vietnam, Dutch, Spanish, and Azerbaijan Grands Prix. No new race dates have been given. The 2020 Monaco Grand Prix has been canceled and won't be rescheduled.

NASCAR: The Atlanta Motor Speedway and Homestead-Miami Speedway races have been indefinitely postponed. The series later postponed all races through May 3, including those at Bristol Motor Speedway, Richmond Raceway, Talladega Superspeedway, and Dover International Speedway. The series plans to resume its schedule on May 9 at Martinsville Speedway, and intends to run its entire 36-race schedule this year, with postponed races to be rescheduled at a later date.

The **Goodwood Festival of Speed** has been postponed.

IndyCar: All Indycar races for March and April have been canceled, including the Grand Prix of St. Petersburg, the Grand Prix of Alabama, the Grand Prix of Long Beach, and the IndyCar Challenge at the Circuit of the Americas. They will not be rescheduled. The Indy 500 Open Test is also off. The Indianapolis Grand Prix has been delayed to July 4, while the Indianapolis 500 has been delayed until August 23. The Indy 200 at Mid-Ohio has been moved forward one week, to August 7-9.
